This music education and enrichment of the Houston Symphony League Bay Area for our community takes place because of an outstanding, all-volunteer organization. It performs like a symphony too, each member playing their part, serving together. The talent, expertise, and experience of each member are extraordinary contributions to our organization, and are especially appreciated when we are working together.

As we make our name HSLBA known in the community, we also are supporting the Houston Symphony. Spring, Summer, Autumn, Winter -- the Houston Symphony is performing! As both the Houston Symphony League Bay Area and the Houston Symphony end their seasons, opportunities to serve and to hear the music still abound.

June 29 - 2011 Young Artists Competition at the Houston Symphony presented by Fidelity. Seven students from Houston area schools are competing for the grand prize, performing with the Houston Symphony Pops at Miller Outdoor Theatre. Last year's winner was a vocalist from Clear Lake High School.

Music has always been part of my life, beginning with \$1 piano lessons every Saturday morning. IMA HOGG COMPETITION

It's Ima time again! The annual Houston Symphony Ima Hogg Competition will take place June 2-4 at Stude Concert Hall at the Shepherd School of Music, Rice University. The semifinals on Thursday, June 2 are free and open to the public. Beginning at 9 am, 10 semifinalists will each play two concertos with piano accompaniment. At the end of the round, four finalists are selected. Those four then perform one concerto with the Houston Symphony at the final round concert on Saturday, June 4. Tickets for the concert are available through the Houston Symphony Box Office at 713-224-7575.

Ima Hogg was one of the founders of the Houston Symphony, and this event named in her honor has reached new heights since the addition of the Houston Symphony in the finals round, first done in celebration of the Competition's 30th anniversary in 2006. The Bay Area League provides a much appreciated lunch for the orchestra musicians and finalists during rehearsals on the Friday in-between Thursday's semis and Saturday's finals.

The Competition's silver medalist will perform with the Symphony at Miller Outdoor Theatre on Saturday, June 25, and the gold medal winner performs at the Symphony's Houston Chronicle Dollar Concert on Saturday, July 9. All Houston Symphony League volunteers get a FREE pass to the Dollar concert (what a deal!) along with an invite to the Symphony's Education Volunteer Appreciation event which precedes the concert.

Here are the 2011 semifinalists –

Mary Bowden is a graduate of Curtis and Yale and is currently a member of the Richmond Symphony trumpet section. She has won competitions in Switzerland and Australia, and was an Ima Hogg semifinalist in 2010.

Stanley Chyi is an oboe performance graduate of Northwestern and Rice. He has been awarded many prizes and performed with orchestras throughout the Midwest.

Violinist Eunice Kim is currently enrolled at the Curtis Institute of Music. She debuted with the Korean Broadcasting Symphony at the age of 7 and has participated in numerous competitions and performances since that time.

Cellist Benjamin Lash attends the Colburn School at USC. He has won numerous awards and competitions and has appeared in many solo performances around the country.

Pianist Esther Park currently attends The Yale School of Music and is a graduate of The Juilliard School. She has won several prestigious competitions in the United States and Germany, and has performed in solo recitals across the US and Europe.

Brook Speltz studies cello at The Juilliard School and is a graduate of Curtis. In addition to receiving numerous awards, he has appeared as soloist with a number of orchestras, and in recital with societies and festivals in several locations.

Clarinetist Maksim Shtrykov, from Belarus, received a DMA at CUNY and a MM at Juilliard. He has performed in recitals and chamber music groups in many locations throughout the American northeast as well as in Eastern Europe. His orchestral experience, competitions, and awards also span two continents.

Dawn Wahn is currently enrolled at Stony Brook University and is a graduate of Yale and The Juilliard School. She has won numerous string competitions and has appeared as violin soloist with orchestras and chamber groups in Alice Tully Hall and Lincoln Center, among others.

Siwoo Kim is pursuing a BM at Juilliard and is a graduate of the Music Institute of Chicago pre-college program. In 2010 alone he won the Crescendo Music Award and placed at the California and Corpus Christi International Music Competitions. Since 1993 he has had numerous solo performances with orchestra and in recital.
