Jeong-Suk Bae is currently a Doctor of Musical Arts candidate in Organ Performance at University of Houston, organist at St. Peter's United Methodist Church in Katy, assistant organist at the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, and guest organist for Chorus Angelorum, a semi-professional Anglican evensong choir. She previously worked with other choirs including Houston Cecilia Chamber Choir, UH Choral Artists, and St. Laurence Chamber Choir in Sugarland.

Major performances this year include First-Friday organ recital series at the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, two concerts with UH Concert Chorale (programs include Bernstein's 'Chichester Psalms' and Rutter's 'Requiem'), and Chorus Angelorum Gala in April (playing Soler's Organ Quintet no.6).

She holds music degrees from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, TX and Chong-Shin Presbyterian University in South Korea. Her paper 'Sixteenth- and Seventeenth-Century Continuo Improvisation and Its Application to the Slow Movements of Buxtehude's Trio Sonatas Op. 1 and 2' will be presented in the Westfield Conference, April 2013.
