Concerto Competition Winners to Perform at HSLBA March 12



The Houston Symphony League Concerto Competition winner, Jasper Snow, viola, and 3rd place winner, James Cooper, cello, will be the featured artists at the March 12 meeting of the Houston Symphony League Bay Area (HSLBA). The meeting will be held at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, 18220 Upper Bay Road in Nassau Bay.

Socializing begins at 10:00 am followed by a brief business meeting and the program.

Included in the program will be a variety of solo music and duets such as:

- Viola Sonata #1 in F Minor - Brahms
- Duet with Two Obligato Eyeglasses - Beethoven
- Apres Un Reve - Faure
- Viola Spaces - Nine Fingers - Knox
- Pezzo Capriccioso Op. 62 - Tchaikovsky
- Two Songs Op. 91 - Brahms

Jasper Snow, age 17, is a viola soloist, chamber musician and orchestra leader. Career highlights for this exceptional young musician include gold medals in the 2014 Houston Symphony League-Concerto Competition, the 2014 Houston Youth Symphony Concerto Competition, and the 2014 High School for the Performing and Visual Arts Concerto Competition. He was selected as the 2014 Young Arts Winner and in 2012 was an Interlochen Arts Camp Emerson Scholar. Jasper will debut with the Houston Symphony in the 2014-2015 season performing Walton's Viola Concerto with Maestro Robert Franz.

James Cooper, 17, is a senior in the music program at Houston's High School for the Performing and Visual Arts (HSPVA). James began his cello studies at age 9 and now serves as the principal cellist for his high school orchestra, for the Houston Youth Symphony, for the Texas High School All State Symphony and the Boston University Tanglewood Institute Symphony. He has performed as soloist and concerto competition laureate with the Houston Civic Symphony and the Houston Youth Symphony. James also plays with Trio Ultraviolet, a clarinet, piano and cello trio.

Charles Taubor, faculty member at Rice University will serve as accompanist.
