Anthony Parce has distinguished himself as a violist eager to explore the vivacity of today's classic music world. As a Community-Embedded Musician he has taught extensively in area schools from pre-k through college and performed regularly in the Houston Symphony. In addition to being a regular principal of the Symphony, Parce performed chamber music with Christian Tetzlaff, Jessye Norman, and Anne Marie McDermott. Parce has attended the Verbier, Schleswig-Holstein, Tanglewood, Artosphere, and Britten-Piers summer festivals, as well as the National Orchestral Institute, Domaine Forget and the Music Academy of the West. He holds degrees from the New England Conservatory and Rice University's Shepherd School of Music.

Born and raised on a farm in northern Illinois, Hellen Weberpal began her cello studies at age ten. She received her Bachelor of Music at DePaul University, and her Master of Music from Rice University, under the tutelage of the Houston Symphony's Principal Cellist Brinton Averil Smith. Since 2012, Weberpal has been performing regularly with the Houston Symphony. Her other orchestral experiences include positions with the Shepherd School Symphony and Chamber Orchestras, the Texas Festival Orchestra, the DePaul Symphony and Chamber Orchestras, among many others. Weberpal has worked in the Cypress-Fairbanks Independent School District, Klein ISD and Houston ISD as a private cello teacher and sectional coach.

A Musicological Moment with Martha

2018 marks the centennial of the birth of Leonard Bernstein (August 25, 1918-October 14, 1990), one of America's greatest orchestra conductors and composers. One of the great joys of my life was singing under his baton twice with the Westminster Choir College Symphonic Choir and the New York Philharmonic. Leonard Bernstein was the opposite of everyone I had met before. I was a sheltered preacher's kid studying church music and in comes Bernstein to our first rehearsal chain smoking and swearing like a sailor! But I quickly learned to produce the sound he wanted the

best I could and I have never seen a conductor since with his charisma and passion for music. His facial expressions always told you exactly what to do.

Bernstein is famous for making his debut with the New York Philharmonic on short notice. He was 25 and Bruno Walter, the guest conductor, fell ill and could not go on stage. With no rehears al, Bernstein stepped on stage and conducted works by Schumann, Wagner and Richard Strauss. He received rave reviews on the front page of the New York Times.

Besides being the Conductor of the New York Philharmonic, he was a masterful composer and was the first great American

composer educated in America. The Houston Symphony Orchestra will be performing Bernstein's Serenade after Plato's Symposium February 23-25. You can ride the HSLBA bus to this performance (see above). The Serenade is essentially a violin concerto accompanied by strings and percussions. The five movements each convey Plato's ideas about love, each given by a different speaker.

Bernstein was also a great educator. He will be forever remembered for his television programs about classical music for adults and for children where he shared his passion for music. Be sure to hear a performance of a Bernstein work in 2018!
