



# Michael Schneider - a Pianist with exceptional insight - headlines October program



Our October program features Michael Schneider October 10, 2018 at St. Thomas the Apostle Church, 18300 Upper Bay Road, Nassau Bay, Texas. Following a social time beginning at 10:00 a.m., the program will begin at 10:30 a.m. in the Sanctuary. His program will be "Piano Virtuosi Through the Ages."

Prize-winning pianist Michael Schneider has been hailed as a 'pianist with exceptional insight' and 'performer with great panache' at venues around the world including Carnegie's Weill Recital Hall, the Library of Congress in

Washington DC, the Liszt Museum in Budapest, and the Chopin Festival in Nohant, France at the legendary château of George Sand.. He is a top prizewinner in many competitions including the 7th San Antonio International Piano Competition, the Kosciuszko Chopin and Frinna Awerbuch Competitions in New York, the International Paderewski Competition and International Liszt Competitions in Poland, the LA International Liszt Competition, and the Grace Welsh Prize for Piano in Chicago.

Michael Schneider made his orchestral debut at the age of eleven performing Mozart's Piano Concerto No. 20 with the San Angelo Symphony and has since performed with numerous orchestras in Poland and around the United States

Well known as a solo artist, Michael is also in demand as adjudicator, masterclass teacher, lecturer, collaborator, composer, conductor, and avid musical entrepreneur throughout Texas and abroad. Michael has been featured as TMTA Convention Solo Artist (2008) and over the years has given multiple presentations for TMTA including: "Liszt and the Last Years - a Dramatic Monologue", and "The Art of Practicing: A guide to Problem-Solving".

Michael has been on the faculties of Youngstown State University's Dana School of Music (OH), University of Mary Hardin-Baylor (TX), Concordia University Texas (Austin), as well as adjunct professor at the University of Texas Butler School of Music (Austin).

# **Volunteering for Student Concerts at Jones Hall**

The Houston Symphony League provides volunteer ushers for Student Concerts throughout the school year. Typically, there are 5,000 students who attend the concerts in a day. Concerts are held at twice a day at Jones Hall. Volunteers should be there at 8:30 (if you are working the first concert) and 10:30 (if you are working the second concert). Most volunteers work both concerts and you are typically done by 12:15, but supporting one is fine.

You can take the HOV lane to get downtown on time and avoid rush hour traffic. **PARKING IS REIMBURSED BY THE SYMPHONY.** You have to pay when you park but get reimbursed before leaving. Parking is \$12.00.

Usher duties are to escort the students to their seats. A school will be ready to enter the hall. You take them to their seats and then return to the lobby to get another group. It is not a difficult task but does require quite a bit of walking and some time spent outside unloading the school buses.


I was disappointed that we didn't get to have the meeting because I had really looked forward to seeing all of you!
